Dear Mr Hosie Mp for Dundee East,

I would like to congratulate the Scottish National Party on recently forming a minority Scottish Parliament Government following the May 2007 elections. On another matter I have as yet to receive the correspondence from your constituency office that you previously promised me based on your meeting with the ABPI in March 2007, or for that matter correspondence following my most recent letter dated 18th March (see enclosed).

Additionally since we last met I have written to the General Medical Council (GMC) making a complaint over Dr Alastair Benbow's fitness to practice (see attached response from the GMC). As you will be aware Dr Benbow has been GlaxoSmithKline's spokesperson during now four BBC Panorama Seroxat documentaries spanning 5 years. In the latest documentary Secrets of the Drugs Trials aired on the 29th January 2007 it was disclosed that GlaxoSmithKline had concealed paediatric Paroxetine clinical trial 329, the data indicative that children and young adults are at least 6.4 times more likely to harbour suicidal thoughts and acts compared to those on placebo. Dr Alastair Benbow in the past has vigorously defended the defective antidepressant Seroxat stating numerous times that Seroxat does not cause suicide, we now know this not to be the case.

Dr Alastair Benbow should now be struck off by the GMC over his involvement in placing children and young adults at risk of suicide from a drug that ought to have helped alleviate mental health disorders for which Seroxat has a license to treat, but which has been shown to achieve the exact opposite. Rather than an antidepressant Seroxat (Paroxetine) has proved to be a potent depressant making individuals more likely to suffer suicidal ideation, suicidal attempts, and completed suicide. I would be obliged if you could take up the matter with the General Medical Council who as you will see from the attached letter of correspondence have refused to investigate Dr Alastair Benbow's involvement in knowingly placing the lives of Seroxat patients at grave risk, calling into question his fitness to practice.

I look forward to receiving correspondence from your constituency office at your earliest convenience that you have taken on board the issues discussed in this letter and that of 18th March 2007.
